

Description: The first building of Geneva Medical College, the Middle Building stands between Geneva Hall on the right and Trinity Hall on the left. A horse and wagon are visible to the right. Built by A. A. Bird of Ithaca in 1835, it was refurbished in 1846 to house the library, recitation rooms and President's office. A cupola was later moved to the Middle Building from Geneva Hall. The building burned in 1885.
