Advocacy, Grants, & Communication

Advocacy Efforts

- On Library Advocacy Day, 33 library supporters boarded a CLRC chartered bus to travel to Albany to meet with their legislators
- Syracuse area Legislative Breakfast was hosted by OCPL with 52 attendees
- Utica area Legislative Breakfast was hosted by Munson-Williams-Proctor Arts Institute with 39 attendees
- CLRC coordinated the New York Libraries' booth at the 2016 New York State Fair

Grants Received

- \$10,000 award from the Institute of Museum and Library Services/Mozilla Foundation for digital literacy training
- \$15,000 award from the Central NY Community Foundation for the CNYFi Project
- \$13,494 award from the National Library of Medicine for the Systematic Review workshops

Communications with members

- 40,428 visits to the CLRC website (15% increase) by 19,033 users (23% increase)
- 97 targeted MailChimp announcements sent to members
- 598 listserv messages
- Regula postings on social media via Facebook and Twitter

Member Grants & Awards

CLRC awarded \$40,699.57 in Regional Bibliographic Database funds to the following:

- Little Falls Public Library: \$500 to digitize copies of *The Sphinx* (1908-1915); \$500 to digitize a collection of photographs taken by the Little Falls Camera Club in the 1930s
- Fayetteville Free Library: \$2,000 to digitize issues of the Fayetteville Eagle Bulletin
- New Woodstock Free Library: \$1,250 to digitize a collection of paintings by local artists
- Mid-York Library System: \$5,080 for retrospective conversion of Bridgewater Free Library's catalog records
- Crouse Health Library: \$2,304 to digitize a representative group of early photographs from Crouse Hospital and predecessor institutions
- Manlius Library (in collaboration with Manlius Historical Society): \$3,300 to digitize the *Village of Manlius Collection*, a broad set of photographs depicting the people and places of the village
- Central New York Chapter, National Railway Historical Society: \$1,400 to digitize photographic slides of railroads throughout New York State, most of which date from the 1960s and 1970s
- Hamilton College: \$4,490.57 to digitize and describe the *Wilbour Papers*, documenting the work of American Egyptologists as well as the Women's Suffrage movement
- SUNY College of Environmental Science and Forestry: \$2,950 to digitize the Fletcher *Steele Nursery Order Collection*, which documents the activities of a prominent landscape architect
- SUNY Polytechnic Institute: \$4,500 to create metadata for the *Portraits of Hope Collection: Faces of Resettlement in Central New York*; \$4,000 to create metadata for the *Refugees Starting Over Project*
- Holy Trinity Orthodox Seminary: \$3,925 to digitize a photograph collection depicting the Brotherhood of St. Job of Pochaev, publishers of Russian religious literature
- Ilion Free Public Library: \$4,500 to digitize the Ilion Urban Renewal Collection (1960s 1970s)

Core Services

Resource Sharing

- Member libraries loaned 59,693 items and borrowed 48,908 items
- 8 site visits for OCLC/ILL training
- CLRC subsidized delivery costs of 4,410 items shipped via UPS CampusShip delivery
- CLRC co-sponsored an annual Resource Sharing Workshop with the South Central Regional Library Council
- Medical Information Services Program awarded \$12,846 to member libraries to support medical resource sharing
- Member academic libraries awarded a total of \$128,385 in Coordinated Collection Development Aid

Continuing Education


- 46 professional development programs/workshops were offered

- \$535 was awarded to member libraries for staff professional development


Hospital Library Program

- CLRC's Medical Circuit Librarian provided library services to 3 contract hospitals
- Served 8 hospitals in the region, provided 357 reference inquiries answered and 579 resources delivered
- Collaborative purchase of Stat!Ref, Doody's Review Service, and Nursing Reference Center

Cooperative Purchasing

- OCLC's WorldShare Discovery Service and WorldShare ILL is available to member libraries
- 6 libraries participated in Encyclopedia Britannica subscription
- 10 libraries participated in AskUs 24/7 Virtual Reference Collaborative





Cultural Heritage Services

- 3 new CLRC contributors have joined New York Heritage Digital Collections (New Woodstock Free Library, llion Free Public Library, and Holy Trinity Seminary), bringing the total to 45 contributors from the CLRC region
- 9 new CLRC-area collections were added to New York Heritage Digital Collections, bringing the total to 103 collections from our region; new items were added to numerous existing collections
- 33 CLRC institutions contributed 9,948 records to the Digital Public Library of America (DPLA), as of October 2017
- 18 site visits for digitization or archival consultations with members
- Circuit Archivist pilot conducted with Sisters of St Francis
