# Eligibility & Terms of Use



To be eligible to checkout a hotspot, you must:

- Be at least 18 years old.
- Have a valid library card in good standing
- Agree to participate in surveys and other evaluations that will help the Library determine the merits of the program
- Agree to Sprint's acceptable use policy, which (among other things) prohibits illegal downloading.

# Loan Terms



- Eligible patrons may borrow a kit for 3 (three) weeks
- There are no fees for this service!
- Chromebook must only be connected to Hotspot Network

# What Comes in the Kit?



- Hotspot Box
  - Hotspot Device
  - Charging Cable
  - Instructions
- Chromebook Computer
  - Charging Cable
- Bag

# Lost & Damaged Kits



If the hotspot or computer is lost, damaged, or not returned, there is a fine of \$100 **per device** and your library card privileges will be blocked until the device is returned or the fine is paid.

**Just remember:** What is most important is that these resources come back to the library so that they may be shared again with the community.

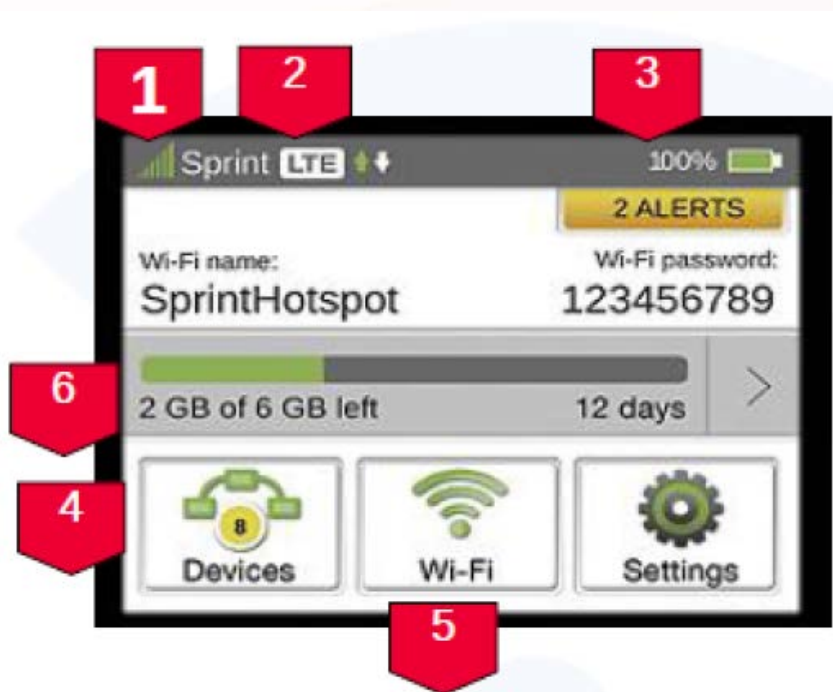

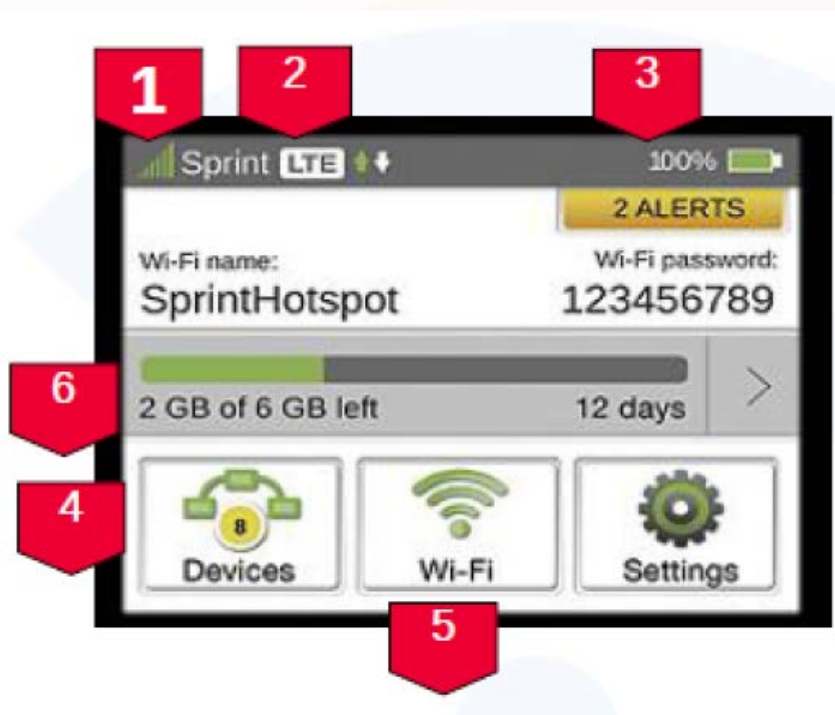

# The Device: The Screen



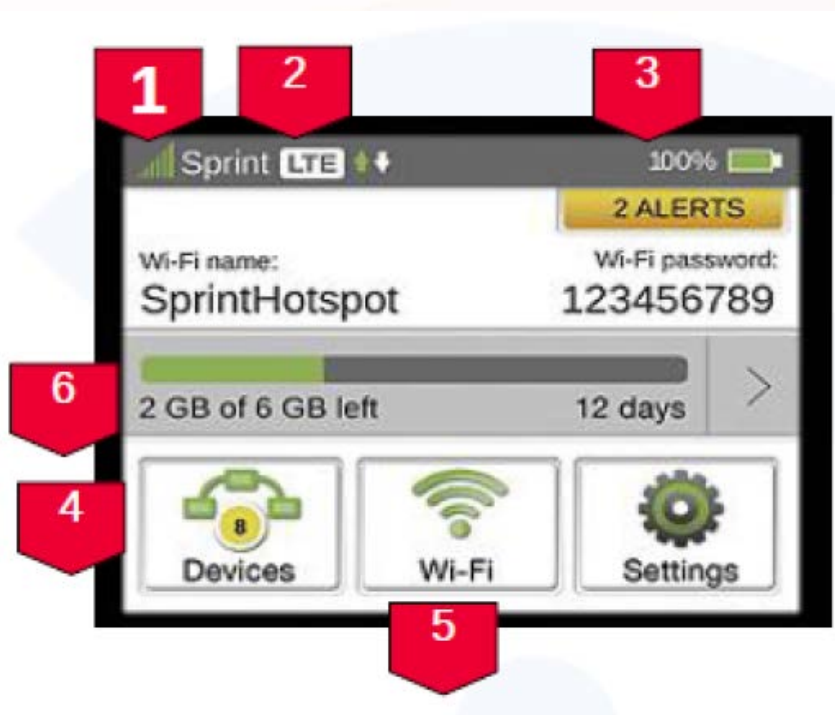
1. **Signal strength**
2. Network type (3g or LTE on Sprint Networks)
3. Battery status
4. Connected devices list – Icon shows the number of connected devices and is gray when no devices are connected
5. Wi-Fi network configuration and management icon is gray when WiFi is disabled
6. Data usage

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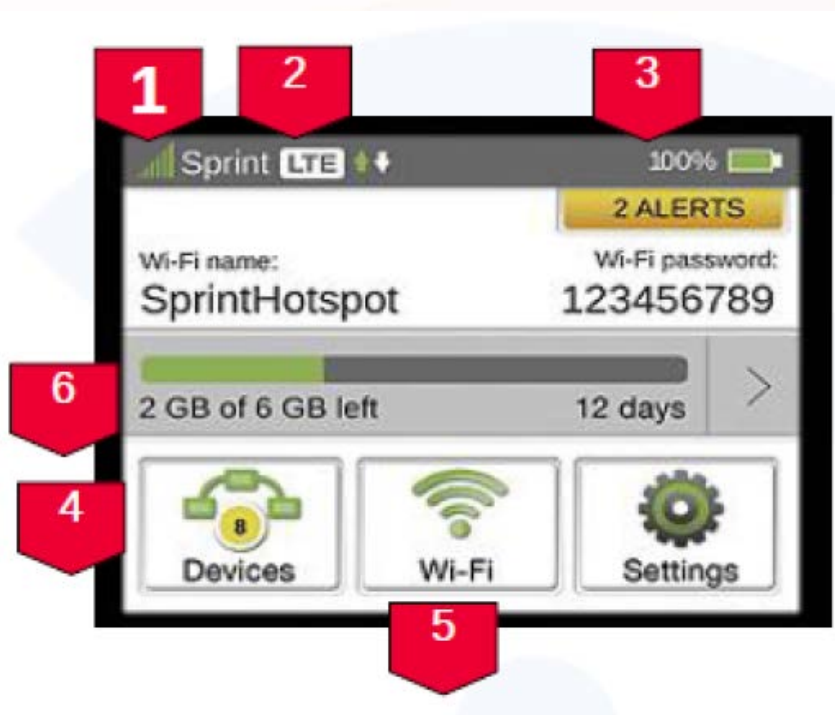
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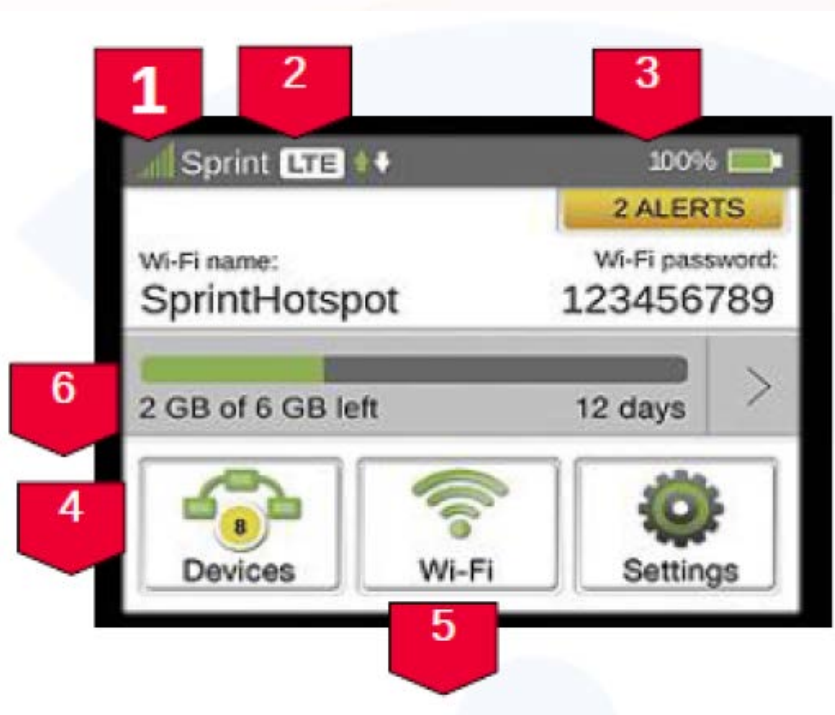
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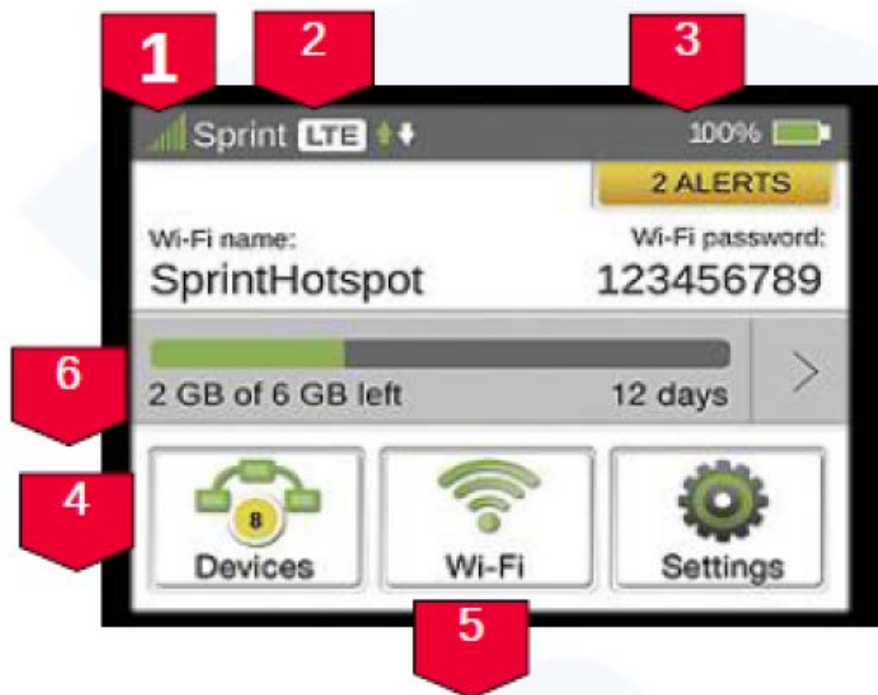


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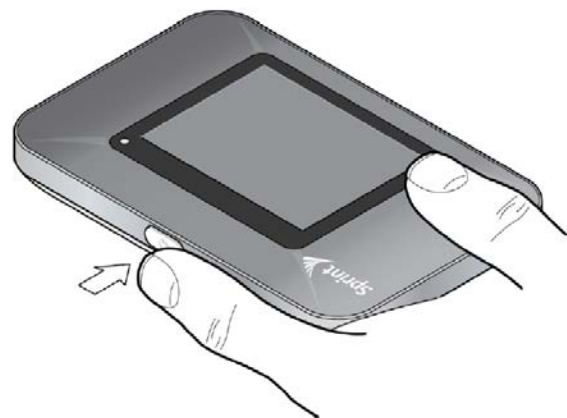
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# Power Management



- **Power On** — Turn the hotspot on by holding the power button until the screen turns on.
- **Power Off**— Tapping the power button will turn off the screen but not the device. Press and hold the power button to turn the device off.
- **Blue Light** — If the blue light is on or flashing, the device is *still* powered on.



# Power Management



Your HotSpot will work from its charged battery alone, or when the device is plugged into a power source.

## Battery

- Charge the battery by plugging the device into the wall charger.
- While the battery is charging the battery charging icon displays.
- When the battery is fully charged, the battery icon is solid.

# Power Management



Your HotSpot will work from its charged battery alone, or when the device is plugged into a power source.

## USB wall charger

- You can use the HotSpot when the battery is installed and the charger is plugged into a wall socket.
- Please ensure the wall socket is located near the equipment and is easily accessible.
- The HotSpot battery charges while it is plugged into the charger.

# Log In



- If you are using a Library Chromebook, the Chromebook will **automatically** connect to the HotSpot
- If you want to log in to the HotSpot using a **different device** (Cell Phone, Personal Computer, etc) you will need to obtain the **password**

# Log In



- On the Library HotSpot, Select **Wi-Fi Name/Password**.
- From your device, display the Wireless Network Connections window, and then click **View Wireless Networks**.



# Log In



- Select **Library HotSpot** (the specific Wi-Fi name is under Guest Wi-Fi on the Sprint HotSpot), click **Connect**, and enter your Wi-Fi password, which is displayed on the LCD display screen under Guest Wi-Fi.
- Launch your device's web browser.

## Power Up the Device

If you have borrowed a Chromebook from your library, Press the **Power** button in the upper right hand corner of the keyboard



# Chromebook



- You will be asked to agree to the terms of use policy every time you start up the computer
- Read carefully and remember to Browse Safely!
- If you have questions about the terms, ask your librarian

# Chromebook



- Library Chromebooks work just like library computers
- You have access to the internet, but not to programs
- When you turn them off or close them, it is like logging out of a library computer – everything goes away.
- Make sure to save your documents to the cloud or a USB drive

# Chromebook



- Check your “Managed Bookmarks” for helpful links and tools
- Use your email address to access cloud applications like Google Drive or Microsoft Onedrive for basic office tasks
  - You **must** have an email address from Google or Microsoft to use their Cloud Applications
  - Both Free! Look in your bookmarks on the Chromebook for details

# Data Usage



- To keep program going, you must use access responsibly
- Treat data like paper: Don't waste it!
- Don't leave streaming services on unless you are using them
- Try to download only what you need
- Abuse will result in slower speeds or termination of connection
- Think Safety! If you are doing something you wouldn't want people to find out about, think twice about doing it

# Safe Browsing



- The HotSpot has a content filter designed to keep children safe on the internet
- No filter is perfect
- Make sure to talk with your family about safe browsing
- You **must** use the HotSpot network with the Chromebook
- You may connect any other device you own (Phones, Tablets, Computers) to the HotSpot if you wish. They will have the same filter in place.




# Safe Browsing



- **STOP:** Before you use the Internet, take time to understand the risks and learn how to spot potential problems.
- **THINK:** Take a moment to be certain the path ahead is clear. Watch for warning signs and consider how your actions online could impact your safety, or your family's.
- **CONNECT:** Enjoy the Internet with greater confidence, knowing you've taken the right steps to safeguard yourself and your computer.

# Privacy



- If you think you'd get in trouble if someone found out what you were doing online, **don't do it!**
- Never send a stranger your personal information
- Look for the lock sign  and "HTTPS" in the browser bar to make sure you are safe when transmitting personal information

# Passwords



- **Don't just use one password.**
  - It's possible that someone working at a site where you use that password could pass it on or use it to break into your accounts at other sites.
- **Create passwords that are easy to remember but hard for others to guess.**
  - When possible, use a phrase such as "I started 7th grade at Lincoln Middle School in 2004" and use the initial of each word like this: "Is7gaLMSi2004."

# Passwords



- **Make the password at least 8 characters long.**
  - The longer the better. Longer passwords are harder for thieves to crack.
- **Include numbers, capital letters and symbols.**
  - Consider using a \$ instead of an S or a 1 instead of an L, or including an & or % – but note that \$1ngle is NOT a good password.
  - Password thieves are onto this. But Mf\$1avng (short for “My friend Sam is a very nice guy) is an excellent password.

# Security



**Never give out your password to anyone (except your parents).**

- Never give it to friends, even if they're really good friends.
- A friend can – accidentally, we hope – pass your password along to others or even become an ex-friend and abuse it.

# Security



## Don't fall for “phishing” attacks.

- Be very careful before clicking on a link (even if it appears to be from a legitimate site) asking you to log in, change your password or provide any other personal information.
- It might be legit or it might be a “phishing” scam where the information you enter goes to a hacker.
- When in doubt, log on manually by typing what you know to be the site's URL into your browser window.
