Creating Stronger Libraries: Advocacy, Grants & Communication

Advocacy Efforts


- 52 library supporters boarded a charter bus to Albany to meet with their legislators for Library Advocacy Day (Mar '16)
- Syracuse Legislative Breakfast hosted by St. Joseph's College of Nursing (Dec '15)
- Utica area Legislative Breakfast hosted by Utica Public Library (Dec '15)
- CNYFi project brought high-speed internet to users of one rural library and two urban libraries (ongoing)
- Hosted State Fair Booth for New York Libraries (Aug '15)

Grants Received

- \$6,000 award from the 40 Below Foundation for the CNYFi Project to pilot mobile hotspots in Central New York
- \$10,000 award from the Institute of Museum and Library Services/Mozilla Foundation for digital Literacy training
- \$15,000 award from the Central NY Community Foundation for the CNYFi Project to purchase mobile hot spots for Central New York Libraries
- \$17,750 award from the Institute of Museum & Library Services for a Sparks! grant to promote development of the EADitor (an xml creation tool for encoded archival description) to assist organizations with the creation of archival finding aids

Communications with Members

- 35,174 visits to CLRC website, by 15,420 users
- 170 targeted MailChimp announcements sent to members
- 687 listserv messages
- Frequent postings on social media via Facebook and Twitter
- Sponsored vendor tables at CNY SLS and Leatherstocking conferences (Fall '15)

Core Services

Resource Sharing

- Member libraries loaned 63,965 items
- Member libraries borrowed 45,964 items
- 5,439 items shipped in UPS CampusShip delivery
- Medical Information Services Program awarded \$8,269 to member libraries to support medical resource sharing
- Member academic libraries were awarded a total of \$128,392 in Coordinated Collection Development Aid

Continuing Education

- 61 professional development programs/workshops
- 1,142 librarians and staff members attended training
- Special Interest Groups (SIGs) included Digital Inclusion, Usage Statistics, Comics and Graphic Novels, Digitization, College & University Archivists, and Gaming
- \$2,199 awarded to member libraries for staff professional development

Hospital Library Program

- Medical Circuit Librarian provided library services to three contract hospitals
- Program served eight hospitals in region
- Collaborative purchase of Stat!Ref, Doody's Review Service, and Nursing Reference Center

Cooperative Purchasing

- OCLC's WorldShare Discovery Service was available to all member libraries
- Six libraries participated in Encyclopedia Britannica subscription
- Ten libraries participated in AskUs 24/7 Virtual Reference Collaborative

Cultural Heritage Services

- Five new partners from CLRC's existing and new membership have joined New York Heritage Digital Collections (41 CLRC-area partners overall)
- 17 new CLRC-area digital collections added to New York Heritage Digital Collections (101 CLRC-area digital collections overall)
- 25 CLRC-area partners contributed 6,526 records to the Digital Public Library of America (DPLA)
- 16 archival and/or digital consultation site visits
- Focus group/training session with CLRC members to instruct and get feedback on the Empire Archival Discovery Cooperative (Jun '16)

Library of the Year

The CLRC Academic Library of the Year is **Upstate Medical University Health Sciences Library**. A user reports, "The Healthy Pet Project including the Baldwinsville Public Library, Fayetteville Public Library, Veterinary Medical Center of Central New York and the CLRC has demonstrated remarkable success. Resources have been brought to public attention and citizens, including children, have learned valuable insights into their own health through workshops that delivered valuable information about pet health."

The CLRC Public Library of the Year is **Cazenovia Public Library**. One of their nominations reads, "Our library is the center of our small community...a typical day sees every available space being used for activities, tutoring, technology assistance and story times. We are incredibly fortunate to have a designated art gallery whose offerings change several times a year as well as a first class small museum. The museum was founded in 1894 and features a 2000 year old mummy as well hundreds of other 'curiosities'. Cazenovians LOVE their library and are very proud of it." Cazenovia Public Library is a member of the Mid York Public Libary System.

The CLRC School Library of the Year is **Chittenango High School Library**. A teacher at the school writes, "The legendary game nights, video club, Bibliotech club, bagel Fridays and girls club are just a few examples of extra activities that Mary Klucznik provides to encourage our students interests and personal growth. Mary is committed to creating a welcoming environment where our students are accepted, encouraged and provided with the resources they need to become outstanding students and citizens."
